



P&C FINANCES



Tattoos – both faction and interschool tatts are still going strong.


Discos – held in term 2 and 4 but could accommodate 3 or 4 in the year. Super simple to run and the kids loved it!

SUSTAINABILITY

2024 Achievements:

- Active Transport:
 - o Upgrades to the mountain bike track
 - Bike ed for the whole school (first time ever 😊)
 - Successfully applied for a 2024/25 Connecting Schools Grant = bike ed for the whole school in 2025
 - Special event days for Ride 2 School Day and Walk Safely to School Day,
 plus the end of year Bike Parade
 - Worked with the Your Move team to run a WA Bike Month program in October
- Uniform Recycling:
 - P+C continued to cover the costs of recycling old style or damaged uniforms through Upparel in Melbourne, rather than end up in landfill.

UNIFORM SHOP

2024 has been a year of consolidation. Stock arrived for back-to-school 2024 just in time for our special opening days (a freight logistical issue, not any problems with supplier). After the arrival of a small top-up order mid-year the second half of the year ran smoothly.



Most of our 2025 order arrived in December, so we are ready to start 2025 fully stocked. Our bank account at the end of the year still had a comfortable surplus after paying for the new back-to-school order, which sets us up well for next year.

We donated \$410.45 directly into the school community by way of the wholesale cost of uniforms to families in need of assistance.

Total income was \$23630.50 compared to \$21673 in 2023.

Based on our annual Treasurer report, our average markup based on income and cost of sales was 29%. Net margin taking into account the value of community donations, and operating costs including recycling of uniform, was 17% which is consistent with 2023.



I'd like to thank all our uniform shop volunteers – your contribution on a Tuesday and Thursday provides a valued service to the school community.

CAMP OUT

This year's P&C Camp Out was a wild success—literally. Just over 80 dads, male role models, and kids embraced their inner Bear Grylls as they battled rain, wind, and the occasional collapsing tent.

Soggy socks? Yes.

Lifelong memories? Absolutely.

SUNDOWNER

We started with a single volunteer to man the BBQ at the sundowner. Here, an organic conversation grew as other Dad's were keen to help out and discuss the secrets of a chargrilled sausage.
